Chlamydia Screening

Chlamydia is the most common STI in the UK. It is easily passed on during sex. Most people (around 7 in 10) don't experience any symptoms, so they are unaware they're infected.

In women, chlamydia can cause pain or a burning sensation when urinating, a vaginal discharge, pain in the lower abdomen during or after sex, and bleeding during or after sex or between periods.

In men, chlamydia can cause pain or a burning sensation when urinating, a discharge from the tip of the penis, and pain or tenderness in the testicles.

It is also possible to have a chlamydia infection in the rectum (bottom), throat or eyes

Diagnosing chlamydia is done with a urine test or by taking a swab of the affected area. The infection is easily treated with antibiotics but can lead to serious long-term health problems if left untreated, including infertility.

Test Kits

- 15-24 year olds can order a free confidential Chlamydia testing kit online
- Under 18s will receive a call for a confidential chat before the kit is posted.
- Anyone aged 18 and over can order a full STI test online, which includes screening for Chlamydia.
- Kits are sent to the address provided by the service user in a plain envelope.
- The kit will contain all the information needed to complete the tests.
- If any of the results are positive the service user will be contacted to arrange treatment.
- Online test kits are free and confidential.
- A valid UK mobile telephone number is required as results are sent via text within 7 working days of us receiving samples.

We also offer Chlamydia testing as part of our Sexual Health screening at our clinics.

Get it On Condom Card Scheme

Get it On (GIO) is the condom distribution scheme running across Hampshire, Portsmouth, Southampton & Isle of Wight. Anyone under 25 can get free condoms from lots of different organisations (GIO site) when they have a GIO C-Card.



GIO sites include:

- GP Surgeries
- Pharmacies (Portsmouth, Southampton & IoW pharmacies cannot issue C-Card)
- Youth services & Voluntary organisations

Issuing a GIO C-Card to a young person

GPs, Practice Nurses, Hampshire Pharmacists, as well as professionals who have attended RSE 1&2 (or equivalent) can issue a C-Card to young people. This should include a Fraser Check (under 16's) and a condom demo. A Child Sexual Exploitation Risk Questionnaire should be completed for all under 18's. *Refer to the CSERQ4 Guidance overleaf.*

Completing the GIO C-Card

If you have given a condom demo and provided condoms mark the first box with a 'D/C' and the date issued. If you have given condoms mark the next box with a 'C' and the date issued. Refer to GIO Guidance overleaf.

Monitoring data

Every time you issue condoms, you must complete this information on a monitoring data form. This is to help us review the effectiveness of the scheme. This data must be returned every 2-3 months.

Where do I order condoms for the GIO scheme?

Condoms and GIO C-Cards are provided by Solent NHS Trust Sexual Health Services. You must complete an order and monitoring form.
